

4 Questions to Ask at Town Hall Meetings

1. 14,000 Americans are losing their health insurance every day. Congress is working on HR 3200, which is very good legislation to solve this problem. How will you vote on HR 3200 when you return to the House of Representatives in September?
2. The insurance industry is spending \$1.4 million each day to kill health care reform because they don't want to compete against a public health insurance option. But giving Americans a choice of a public plan will drive down costs through competition. Will you commit to supporting a public health insurance plan option?
3. We cannot finance health care reform on the backs of the middle class. Many people have good insurance and can't afford to be taxed on it. Will you commit to financing health care reform through progressive measures, such as a tax on the highest income earners, rather than taxing the health care benefits of the middle class?
4. Millions of employers do the responsible thing and provide insurance to their employees. But they are unfairly penalized by employers who don't provide coverage because insurance premiums end up costing \$1100 more on average to cover the uninsured. Will you commit to supporting language to ensure that employers must provide coverage to employees, with subsidies to small businesses?
